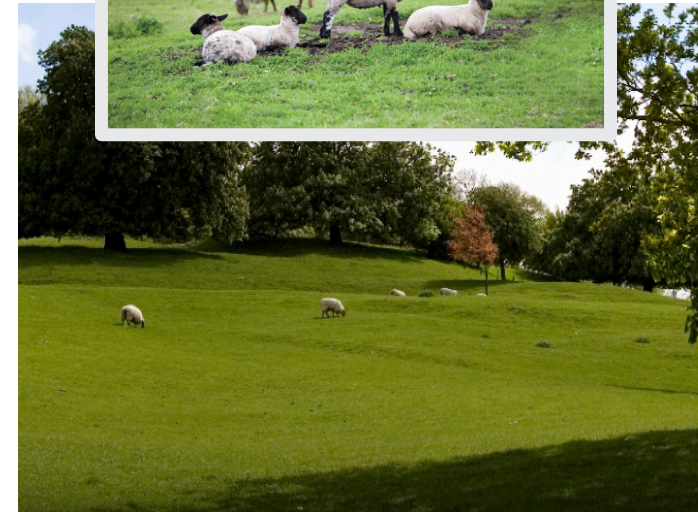

1 Farm Shop & Café

2 Farm Walk Start

3 P.Y.O

Through the summer months we have pick your own strawberries, cherries and raspberries and come October pumpkins.

4 Turkeys

We rear nearly 3000 turkeys every year for Christmas. The day old poults (baby turkeys) arrive at the start of June and once they are old enough they are let free to forage and roam happily in Turkey Paddock.

5 Bullrush Pond

A vital water source for wildlife and breeding ground for dragonflies, frogs and newts.

6 Owl Nesting Box

An owl nesting box is situated in the pear tree at the top of the field, the South Warwickshire Barn Owl Survey monitor the box and collect data to keep figures on the barn owl population in south Warwickshire.

7 Ant Hill Colony

You can clearly see the ant hills of our decades old colony in the field. The colony numbers between 8000-14000 individuals and is protected so the mounds remained undisturbed. Please stay back – they do bite!

8 Panoramic Views

If you walk up to the top of the field where the ancient horse chestnut trees are the views are breath taking. Towards the west views of the Vale of Evesham. The Malvern Hills, Broadway Tower and Bredon Hill.
